Year of Report: 2009-10

Part A: The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

The IQAC was formed in 2010. Hence, comprehensive plan of action for quality enhancement of the institution could not be chalked out for 2009-10.

Part B:

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The College strives to provide maximum access to girl students from all sections of the society in order to achieve the objective of imparting quality education for all round development and empowerment of women. The eligibility criteria for admission to most of the courses offered by the institution is kept at the minimum level stipulated by the affiliating university in order to provide opportunity for higher education to students from less privileged background or to the first generation learners.

All round efforts are made by the faculty to motivate students to achieve distinction in academics through regular classes, tutorials and remedial classes.

Job oriented courses like Bachelor's degree in Communicative English, Journalism and Mass Communication have been introduced to prepare students for employment in newly emerging fields. To fulfill the objective of motivating students for self employment and entrepreneurship, a new course like Bachelor's degree in Fashion and Apparel Design has been introduced in the College.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):

No new academic programme could be initiated during 2009-10. However, the College has a record of introducing new academic programmes every year since 2004-2005 [B.A. Sociology (Honours) in 2004-05, B.Sc. Geography (Honours) in 2005-06, B.A. Communicative English (Major) in 2006-07, B.A. Journalism and Mass Communication (General) in 2007-08, B.A. Journalism and Mass Communication (Honours) in 2008-09 and Bachelor of Fashion and Apparel Design in 2008-09].

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction;

The College does not have freedom to introduce innovations in the undergraduate curricula prescribed by the affiliating Calcutta University. The faculty, however, introduce innovations in the transaction of their respective curriculum in accordance with the aptitudes and needs of their students.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started :

The Bachelor's degree course in Fashion and Apparel Design is interdisciplinary in nature as the curriculum incorporates papers on Economics and English taught by the faculty of these departments. The Honours courses in Geography, Sociology and Education include Statistics in their curriculum.

The College has implemented the examination reforms introduced by the affiliating Calcutta University.

The extension and outreach programmes of the college have received further boost with the launching of the National Service Scheme (NSS) in the college in October, 2009. The NSS unit of the college observed Human Rights Day on 10th December, 2009. Youth week was observed during 11th to 15th January, 2010 wherein programmes on Constitutional Rights, Women and Law etc. were held for awareness of students. A special NSS camp was held during 22nd to 29th March, 2010. The special feature of this camp was the slum visit of students and faculty for interaction

with the slum dwellers, holding of eye camp, haemoglobin and blood grouping camp in slum and obtaining feed back from those concerned.

Books on general knowledge namely, Manorama Year Book – 2009, Pearson's General Knowledge Manual 2009, and Pearson's General Knowledge Studies 2009 have also been added to the library collection.

28. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students:

Teachers and students of the college have good access to computers and internet. Most of the teachers are well acquainted with use of computer and internet. For all students, the college jointly with Webel Informatics Ltd. offers a diploma course on PC application which includes fundamental operating systems, Microsoft office and business tool, Internet, C programming language. This course upgrades beginners to a techno-friendly enterprise environment.

29. Financial aid to students:

Freeships amounting to a total of Rs. 17,410/- have been given to four students (two from 1st year, one from 2nd year, one from 3rd year,) during 2009-10.

30. Support from the Alumni Association and its Activities:

- a) Rani Birla Girls' College Alumni Association awarded The 'Highest Achiever Academic Medal' for achieving the highest aggregate among students of the college at the B.A. (Hons) final examination, 2008 of the University of Calcutta. The Alumni Association has been awarding this medal at the annual prize distribution ceremony of the college every year since 2006.
- b) Rani Birla Girls' College Alumni Association celebrated International Women's Day in the college auditorium with the screening of the film 'Monalisa's Smile'

- c) The annual re-union of the association was named 'Essence 2010' where a panel discussion on fashion and a clothesline display was held with some famous fashion personalities of the city as invited guests. The event was organized with a view to boost the newly started fashion and apparel design department of the college.
- d) Rani Birla Girls' College Alumni Association organized 'Best Of Luck Party' for the students appearing at the B.A. final examination of the University of Calcutta.
- e) Other regular activities of the Rani Birla Girls' College Alumni Association were script reading and play reading sessions and annual picnic.

31. Support from the Parent-Teacher Association and its Activities:

The Parent-Teacher Association has not yet been formally established in the college. However, parents meet teachers regularly as the parent-teacher meetings are held in each session.

32. Health services:

The College maintains First Aid boxes to offer immediate medical help to students wherever the need arises. In more serious cases, the College ensures that the students receive proper medical attention by calling in a qualified Doctor. Every student is also made a member of the Students' Health Home at the time of her enrolment in the College. A Sick Room is available in the college.

33. Performance in sports activities:

Physical training classes are held regularly under the supervision of a trained physical instructress. Yoga and Aerobics are practiced by the students under her supervision. Outdoor games like volleyball, badminton, throwball, kabaddi etc. are played on the

college ground. The annual sports is a special attraction for students as well as for the staff of this college. The students participate regularly in Inter Non-Government College Athletic Meet organized by the University of Calcutta, Kho-kho and Badminton championships organized by the University as well as by the Sports Authority of India (SAI).

34. Incentives to outstanding sportspersons:

There was no outstanding sportsperson among students of the college during 2009-10.

35. Student achievements and awards:

An impressive prize distribution ceremony is held in the college on the occasion of Annual Day. Students are awarded prizes for outstanding performance in academics as well as in sports. Students securing highest marks in each subject at the University examinations (Part-I, Part- II & Part – III) are awarded. The best graduates in Honours and General streams are also awarded.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling Cell:

The college has been providing psychological counselling and career counseling services to students. For career counselling, presentations by various institutes like the NIIT, Frankfinn, Wigan & Leigh College (I), Scaffold Academy, National Institute of Management etc. Seminar on GRE, GMAT, IELTS, TOEFL and careers abroad for students are also held in the college.

37. Placement services provided to students:

The institutional efforts to provide placement services to students did not materialize during 2009-10. However, more planned efforts in this direction are being taken.

38. Development programmes for non-teaching staff:

No specific programme for non-teaching staff could be organized in the college during 2009-10. However, the college sanctions leave to non-teaching staff for appearing at examinations and for attending contact classes organized by Distance Education courses of Open Universities. Ms. Swapna Mal, Library Clerk of the college has appeared at and passed the MLIS Examination of Netaji Subhas Open University during 2009-10. The ward(s) of non-teaching staff studying in this college receive freeship.

39. Best practices of the institution:

Rani Birla Girls' College has always focused on maintaining the high standard of academic and all-round development of its students and staff. Towards this end, the college has adopted various mechanisms for quality assurance within the existing academic and administrative systems. These are:-

- i) Setting the criteria for admission to each undergraduate programme and adhering strictly to them.
- ii) Counselling of students seeking admission to various courses by teachers of respective departments to assess their aptitude.
- iii) Appointment of teachers having qualification as per U.G.C. norms and with proper motivation in government sanctioned as well as in management appointed posts.
- iv) Ensuring regular participation of teachers in orientation programmes, refresher courses, faculty up-gradation programmes, seminars and workshops.

- v) Encouragement of research activities of teachers through granting permission for Faculty Improvement Programmes, special study leave etc.
- vi) Regular Class Tests, Tutorials, Mid-term and Selection tests for reviewing students' performance;
- vii) Holding remedial classes for slow learners and encouraging advanced learners to present papers at departmental seminars.
- viii) Regular meetings of the Governing Body, the Teachers' Council and of the various sub-committees are held. Regular monitoring of the functioning of different departments and sub-committees is undertaken.
- ix) Evaluation of teachers' performances through feedback received from the students as well as through self-appraisal method.
- x) Availability of all information relating to the college on the college website.
- xi) Modernization and regular updating of college library.
- xii) Proper designing and maintenance of laboratories for lab-based subjects Geography Laboratory, Fashion and Apparel Design Laboratory, Sound Recording and Video Editing Studio, etc.
- xiii) Computerization of the college office for maintaining accounts, student records, preparation of results, etc.
- 40. Linkages developed with National / International, academic / research bodies
- The college in collaboration with Webel Informatics Limited (the IT nodal agency of Government of West Bengal) has set up "Rani Birla Girls' College IT Academy"

which is offering certificate courses on (i) PC Application and (ii) Multimedia animation, to all students enrolled in the college.

• Seminars are arranged in the college in collaboration with the English Study Centre, an organization of college teachers of the department of English.

 The college organizes career counselling, sessions jointly with various professional institutes like the NIIT, Frankfinn, Wigan & Leigh College (I) Scaffold Academy, National Institute of Management etc. Seminar on GRE, GMAT, IELTS, TOEFL and careers abroad for students are also held in the college

 Some members of the faculty are attached to various departments of the University of Calcutta, Vidyasagar University and also to open Universities such as Netaji Subhas Open University as guest teachers.
